Text: Matthew 7:1-6

Introduction:

How does Society's judgment line up with God's judgment?

Matthew 7:1 "Do not judge, or you too will be judged."

1) Understanding and Defining Judgment:

- i. Bible Dictionary of NIV Terms defines judgment as:
 - a) a decision or opinion
 - b) a decision of guilt or innocence made by a judge in the court of law; punishment decided on by a court c) a decision from God, especially the final judgment when God will reward those who believe in Him and condemn all others to hell.
- ii.) Comparisons:
 - a) Judgment versus condemnation
 - b) Judgment versus discipline
 - c) Judgment out of anger

2) The Judgment of humanity (mankind)

i. A look at judgment throughout the scriptures

 - a) We never know the whole facts or the whole person
 - b) It is almost impossible for anyone to be strictly impartial
 - c) No one is good enough to judge another. (We, as human beings, are all imperfect and we "all fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23)

i) What the Scriptures say:

'Judgment' appears 294 times in scripture

2) The General Epistles are full of God's Judgment to come. (In particular see Jude)

Conclusion:

The offset of judgment is humility; the partners of judgment are compassion and love

- 2. Think of someone who has judged you harshly or incorrectly. What was that like for you?

- 1. Read Luke 6:37-42. How, if at all, are these passages different from those we read in Matthew? Identify some of the words Luke uses that Matthew does not and discuss whether that changes the meaning for you.
- 2. Read Romans 2:1; 14:10 and 14:13 and discuss and respond the same as to Luke 6:37-42 above.
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 4:5. How is the message in that scripture passage different from those of Matthew, Luke and Romans?
- 4. Dr. Pettinger believes that "The offset of judgment is humility and the partners of judgment are compassion and love". Do you agree or disagree? Why or why not?

Application:

- 1. As a group, talk about the ways you might display Godly judgement.
- 2. What steps can we take to stop judging people unfairly?
