# Asking for a Friend

#### Intro:

- Today it is becoming more and more difficult to find our if anything is true!
- POLITICAL CORRECTNESS has made it even dangerous sometimes to declare a thing to be true - if it is not what others around us accept as true

# Do you find yourself accepting or rejecting something based on what you want to be true?

- What is it that determines TRUTH or what is true?
- Witnesses

"The evidence for the New Testament writings is much greater than the evidence for many writings of classical authors, the authenticity of which no-one dreams of questioning. And if the New Testament were a collection of secular writings, their authenticity would generally be regarded as beyond all doubt."

Jesus' disciples would have been very capable of recording His statements accurately, and the evidence demonstrates that they did so probably MORE HONESTLY than many would today.

# We have many first-century non-Christian historians and writers who confirm the life and execution of Jesus:

Cornelius Tacitus, Lucian of Samosata, Flavius Josephus, Suetonius, Pliny the Younger, Thallus, Phlegon, Mara Bar-Serapion,

"These independent accounts prove that in ancient times even the opponents of Christianity never doubted the historicity of Jesus, which was disputed for the first time and on inadequate grounds by

several authors from the end of the 18th, to the beginning of the 20th centuries."

## The support of Archaeology

 "'Luke is a historian of the first rank; not merely are his statements of fact trustworthy ... this author should be placed along with the very greatest of historians." —Archaeologist Sir William Ramsay

'The NT books did not "become" authoritative for the Church because they were formally included in some canonical list; on the contrary, the Church included them in her canon because she "already regarded" them as divinely inspired, recognizing their innate worth and general apostolic authority, direct or indirect.... [Church] councils [did] not impose something new upon the Christian communities but codified what was already the general practice within those communities.' (Bruce)
