Text:

Intro:

We are not just about filling a Church building with people. We are about filling people with God.

Making Room For God

1. Luke 10:38-42 - Mary sitting at Jesus' feet

Before we talk about the need for us to make room for God, we recognize the fact that God first made room for us!

Often the urgent distracts us from what is truly most important, and what is truly most valuable.

Parable of the sower (Matthew 13) - The cares of this life can "choke" out the word of God.

We don't start becoming like Jesus by trying to be like Him. Instead, we start by spending time with Him.

Don't let the temporary value of a task keep you from experiencing the eternal value of the presence of God.

2. Haggai 1:2-4 - What keeps you from making room for your relationship with God?

God has given us exactly enough time to do what he has called us to do

Application - Making Room for God

- 1. Consider doing a de-cluttering of your life to make room for God
- 2. Write a list of your priorities, and a list of your "posteriorities"

What is something you can do less of that will make more room for something more important?

3. Cancel whatever you need to cancel to take time to sit quietly at Jesus' feet

Warm up:

 God? These consequences were based on the covenant (deal
 with God) that the people had agreed to (see Deuteronomy
 28:38-42). We live in a different covenant, but our lives are still
 negatively affected when we don't prioritize God. What are some
 of those affects?
- 3. Read the parable of the sower in Matthew 13:1-8, 18-23. Consider this parable in light of the theme of "Making Room." What can a
