PART 2: FRIENDSHIP

Sermon Notes

Text: John 15:12-15

Intro:

When Jesus is the center of your relationships, you will have healthy relationships.

John 15:12-15

Friends are very influential - 1 Corinthians 15:33

The Book of Proverbs tells us that *friends are consistent* (17:17; 18:24) and *friends tell the truth, even when it hurts* (27:6). A *counterfeit friend is a fair-weather friend* (14:20; 19:6).

"Real friends always let you in, and they never let you down" ~Tim Keller

"Friendship is so weird. You just pick a human you've met and you're like, 'Yep, I like this one,' and you just do stuff with them." ~Bill Murray

Friendship consists of two people standing side by side, looking at the same object together.

The key to Christian friendship is a common friendship with Jesus.

John 15:12-15 - Jesus call us "friend" because we share his pursuits and passions.

The Meaning of Marriage – To help each other become the new creations that God is transforming us into.

Conclusion

John 15:13 - Jesus proved his friendship with us by laying down his life for us.

Life Group Discussion

Warm up:

- 1. What stood out to you about Sunday's sermon? What was interesting? Confusing? Weird? Thought provoking?
- 2. How do you define "friendship"? What do you think of Tim Keller's definition (see notes)? How about Bill Murray's comment (see notes)? How does a friendship happen?

Study & Discussion:

- Read John 15:12-15. Jesus tells us that we prove our friendship with him by doing what he commands. Making commands seems like a strange way to foster a friendship...but consider what command Jesus is referring to (read v. 12 & 17).
 - It seems as though friendship with Jesus is proven by loving the people he loves, in the way that he loves them (v. 12). He said, "...as I have loved you." How has Jesus shown his love for you? How can you practically apply his way of loving to the way you love your friends?
 - Some people treat their friends like servants (v. 15). Some people are fair-weather friends (Proverbs 14:20; 19:6). Have you experienced this? How can we elevate our friendships out of the tendency to "use and abuse" each other, into the kind of friendship that blesses both sides?
- 2. Is it possible for a Christian to have a healthy, mutually beneficial friendship with a non-Christian? Why or why not? Do you struggle to make friends with non-Christians? Do you struggle to make friends with Christians? Why do you think this is so?

- 3. What role does friendship have in a marriage? How can you foster friendship with your spouse?
 - Is it important to have friends outside of your marriage? Why or why not? Are there certain roles a platonic friend can fulfill that your spouse cannot? Why or why not?
